


Little Wildcats Preschool

The Little Wildcats Preschool is a high quality preschool program that is designed to foster pre-academic, social, language, and motor development in children. Little Wildcats is a blended preschool program jointly operated by West Northfield District 31 and the Northern Suburban Special Education District (NSSED) and serves both typically developing preschoolers and preschoolers who have delays in their development.

Our Program:

- -Taught by Early Childhood Teachers licensed in General Education, Special Education, and English Language Learners
- -Supported by teaching assistants and specialists (Speech and Language Pathologist, Occupational Therapist, Physical Therapist, and School Psychologist)

Students:

- -Students can be residents of District 31 or neighboring districts with proof of residency upon registration.
- -Students may begin in the program upon turning 3 years old.
- -Class sizes are limited to 16 children.

Calendar and Hours:

- -The Little Wildcats Preschool closely follows the District 31, Winkelman School calendar.
- -AM session is geared toward 3 year olds and runs from 8:30 am 11:00 am.
- -PM session is geared toward 4 year olds and runs from 12:30 pm 3:00 pm.

Registration and Fees:

- -The program will begin accepting registration on February 1.
- -Registration is completed at the District 31 Office located at 3131 Techny Rd. Northbrook, IL 60062
- -Open enrollment will continue until the classrooms are filled.
- -Tuition is \$3,500.00 *Please note tuition is non-refundable.
- -A \$200 non-refundable deposit is due at registration and is credited toward first tuition payment
- -Upon entering the preschool program, students will be required to have a physical exam and show proof of required immunizations. This is in accordance with the State of Illinois requirements.

Curriculum:

- -Classrooms utilize The Creative Curriculum® as a foundation for instruction.
- -Supplemental curriculum programs place heavy emphasis on early literacy skill development.
- -Opportunities for teacher-directed learning and self-directed exploration at 11 interest areas: blocks, dramatic play, toys and games, art, library, discovery, sand & water, music & movement, cooking, technology, and outdoors.
- -Frequent and ongoing assessment of student skill development.
- -Prepares students to enter kindergarten.
